#### DESCRIPTION

Located in this park is a fallen tree footbridge and a covered shelter, the latter being the only known example of its type. The rusticated rectangular shelter has split log flooring, hewn log benches and a split log roof supported by log posts.

The park was created for the enjoyment of those residing in the surrounding neighborhood, the majority of which was developed by Justin Matthews. Originally owned by the Justin Matthews Company, it was given to the city of North Little Rock at an unknown date.

#### STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

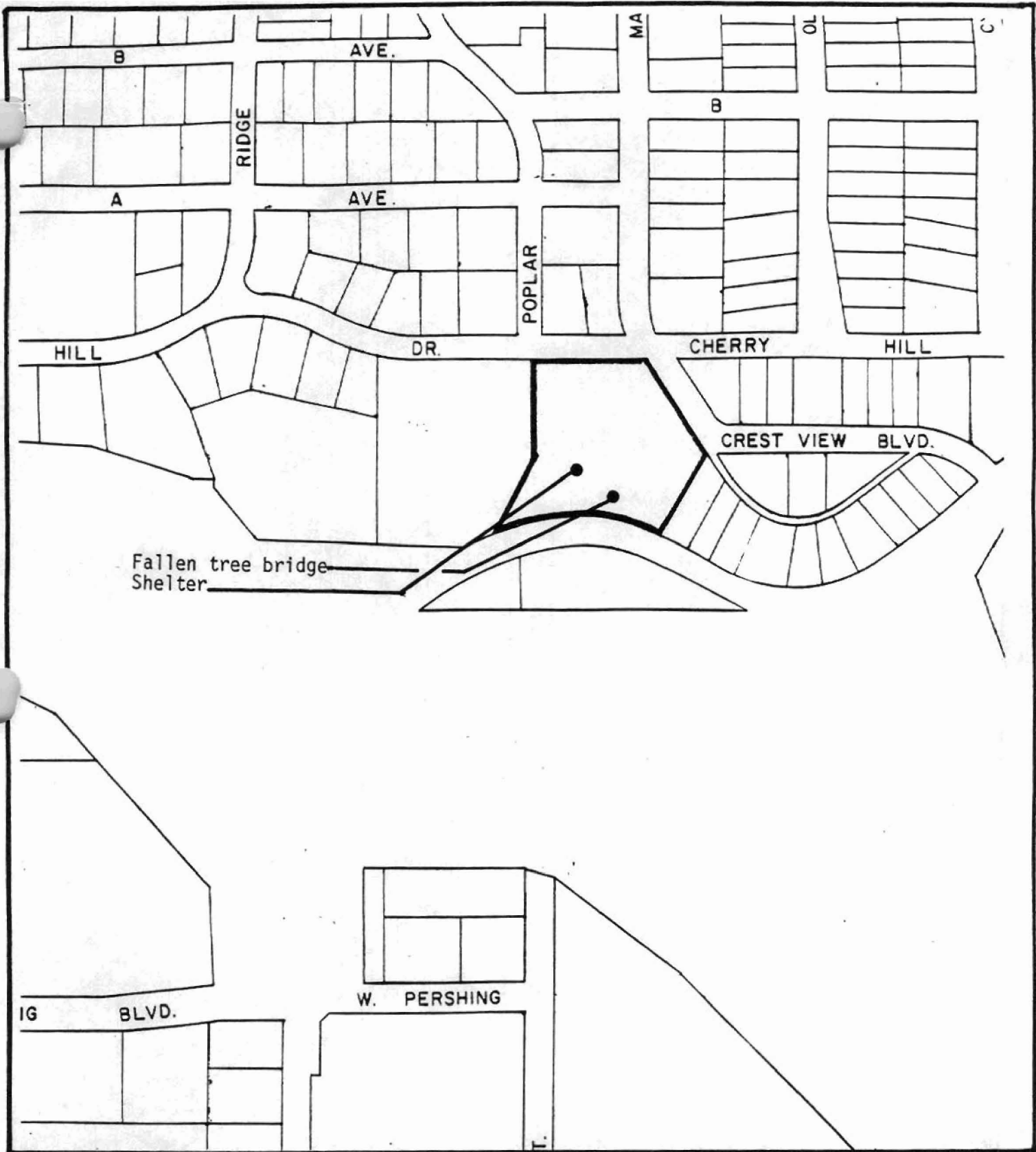
This steeply sloped site was developed by Justin Matthews as a park. Infrequently used and awkwardly located adjacent to an access road to Interstate 40, this property remains a reminder of one of Matthew's fundamental planning strategies. While the fallen tree bridge is typical of Rodriguez' work, the shelter is unusual.

#### VERBAL BOUNDARY DESCRIPTION: (See attached site map)

The boundaries of the sculptures equal their dimensions, plus a margin of ten feet on all sides. The two sculptures are located within Crestview Park, which is shown by the red line on the accompanying map.
