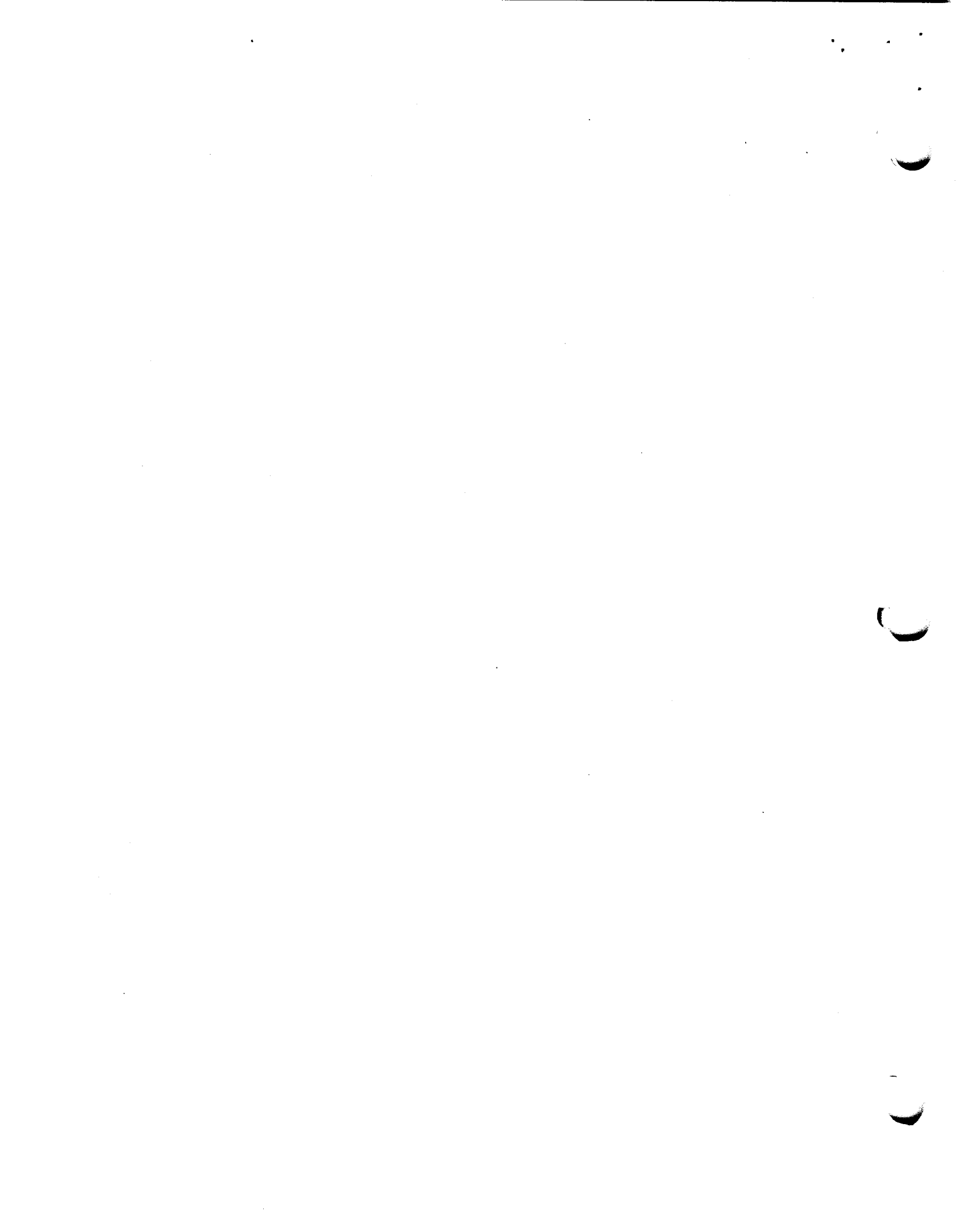

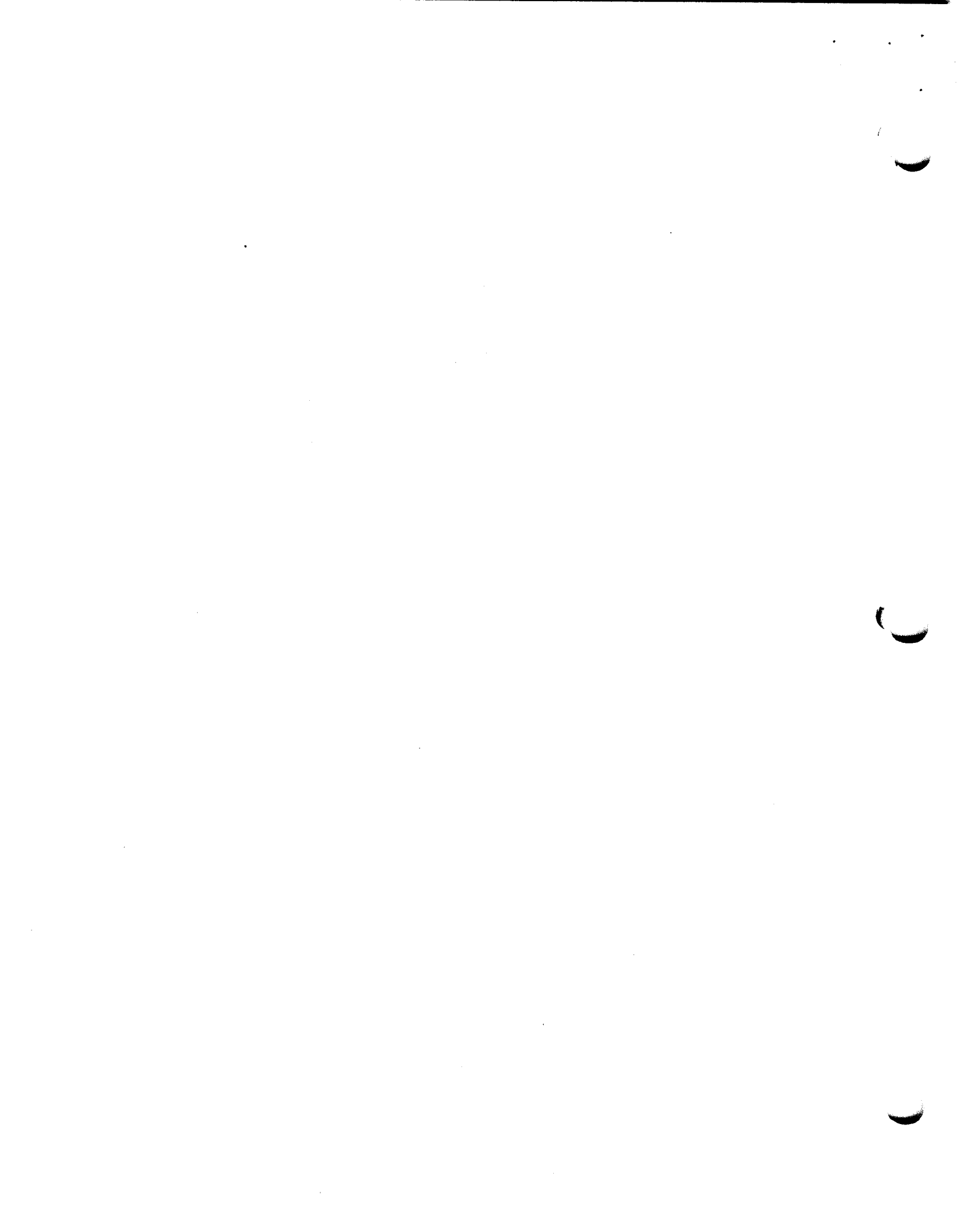

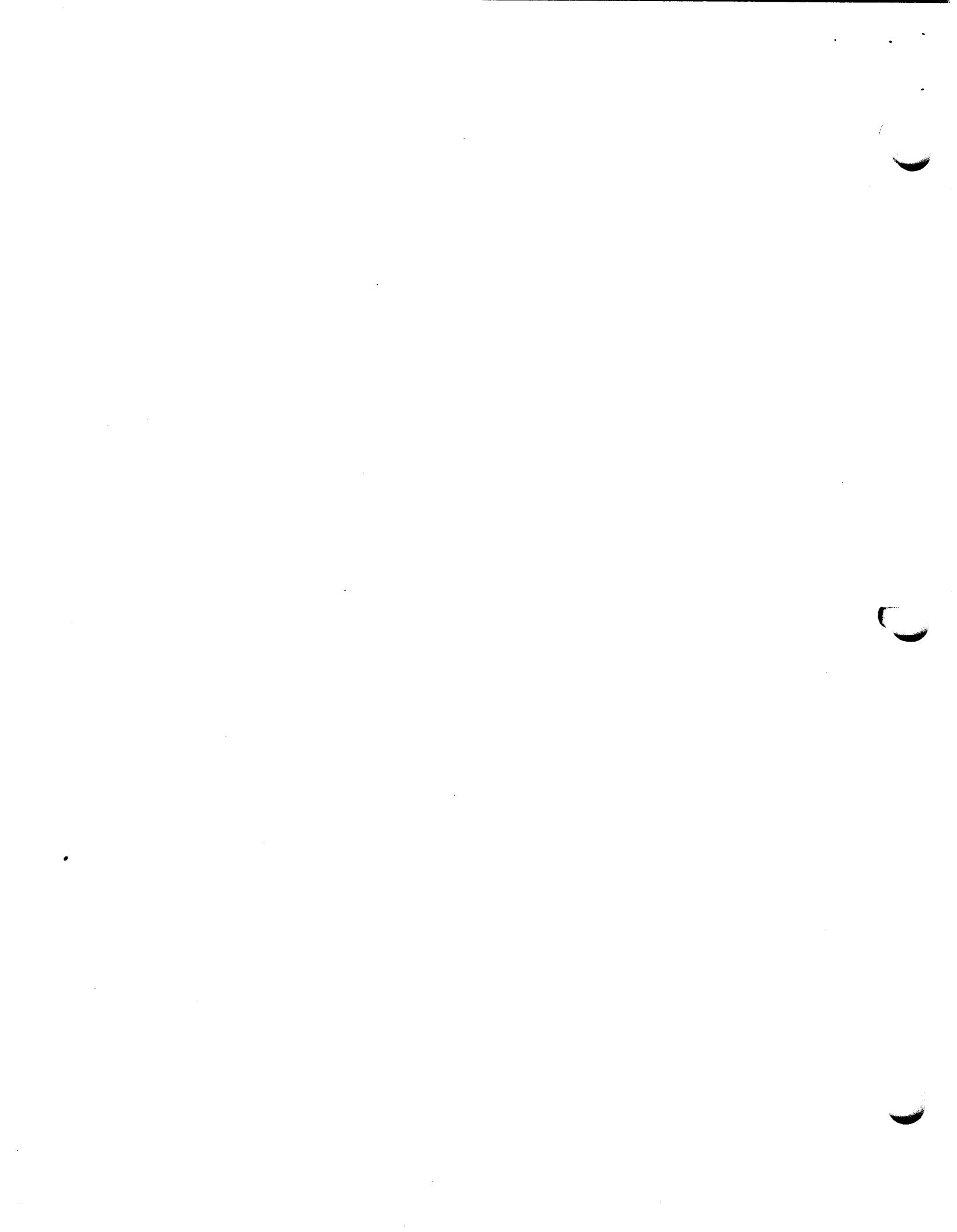

Beginning at a point on the western edge of the associated driveway located approximately 250 feet from its intersection with State Highway 133, proceed westerly along a line running parallel with the building's northern elevation for a distance of 200 feet; thence proceed southerly along a line running parallel with the building's western elevation for a distance of 200 feet; thence proceed easterly along a line running parallel with the building's southern elevation for a distance of 200 feet to its intersection with the western edge of the associated driveway; thence proceed northerly along said edge for a distance of 200 feet to the point of beginning.

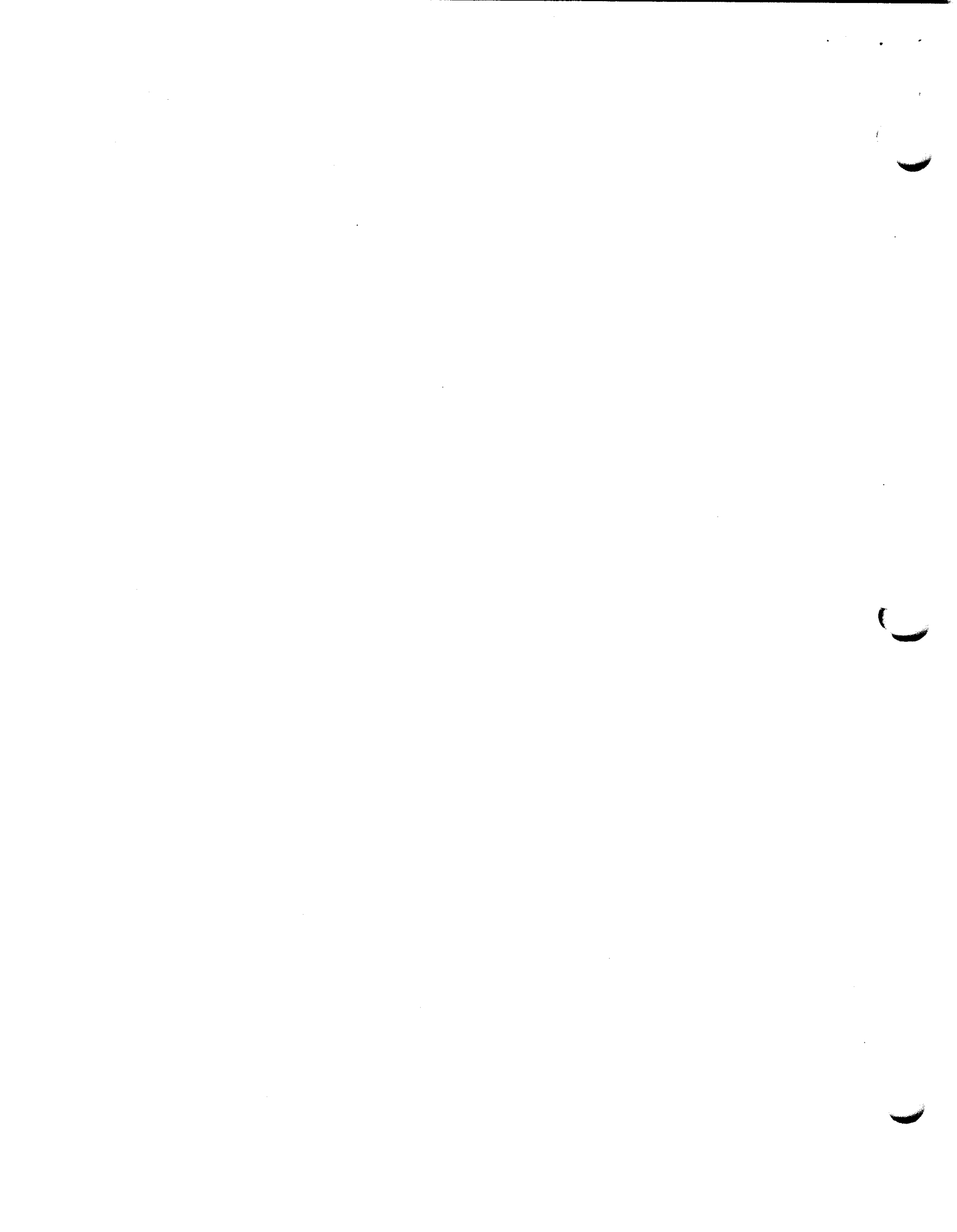

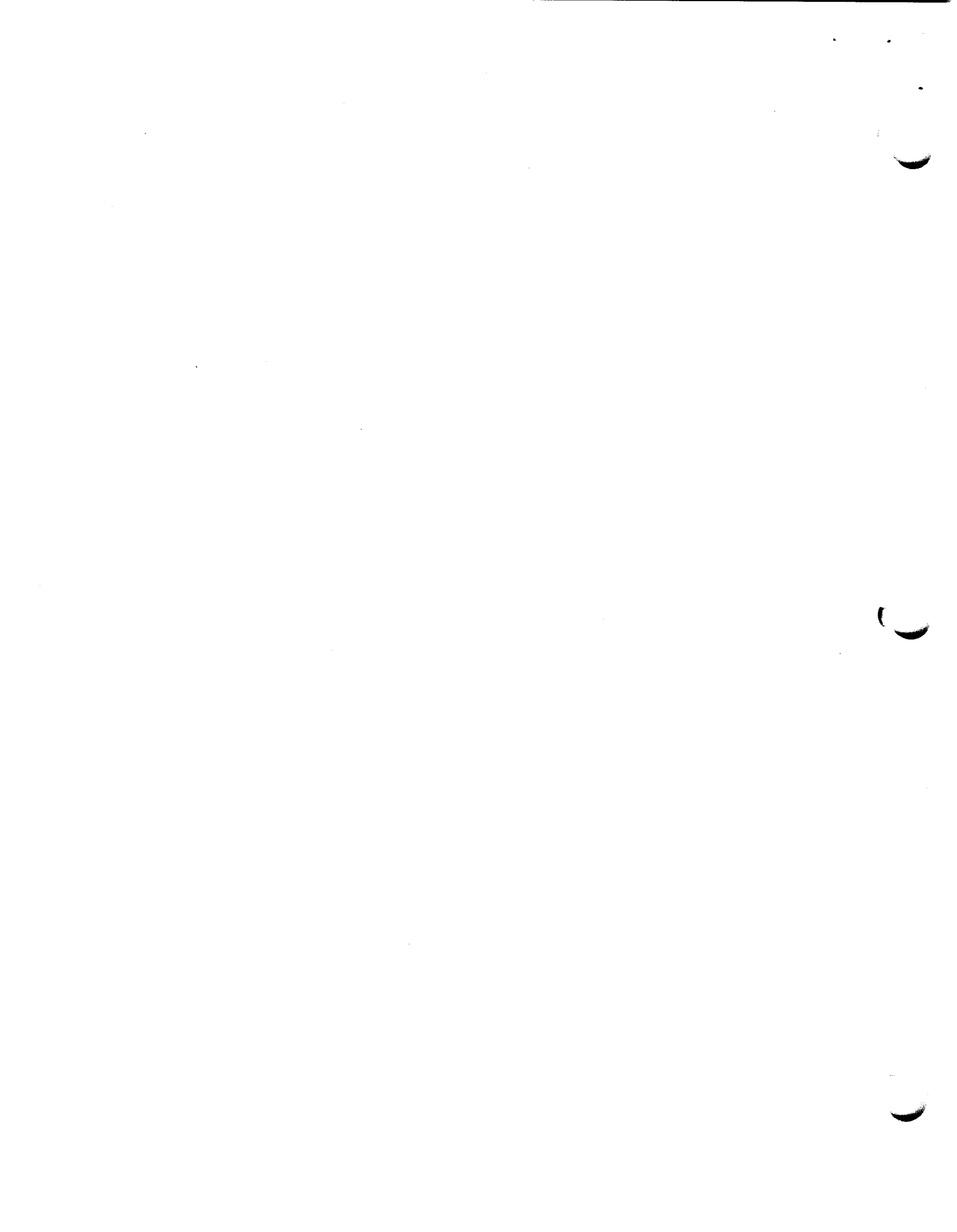
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### Description:

The Crossett Experimental Forest Complex is located south of Crossett on Arkansas Highway 133 roughly one and one-half miles north of the Louisiana State line. Building No. 6 is a one-and-one-half story, rectangular structure with a gabled roof covered with composition shingles. The walls are covered with novelty siding and the structure rests atop a continuous, cast concrete foundation. The northern view of the structure has a pair of six-pane casement windows and a small porch covering a single door entrance to the structure. Two columns support the gabled porch roof which is covered with composition shingles. On the second, half-level is a central, fan-shaped, louvered vent. The western view of the structure has a pair of six-pane casement windows centered on the building. Further to the rear of the structure is a garage style door followed by a six-pane casement window, a single door and a six-pane stationary window, and another six-pane casement window. The southern portion of the structure is a glass, enclosed green house. The eastern portion of the building has a pair of six-pane casement windows in the front and rear of this wall. Between these sets of windows is a double door leading to a more modern building by way of a covered walkway and a single six-pane casement window. The structure has no chimney and is in excellent condition.



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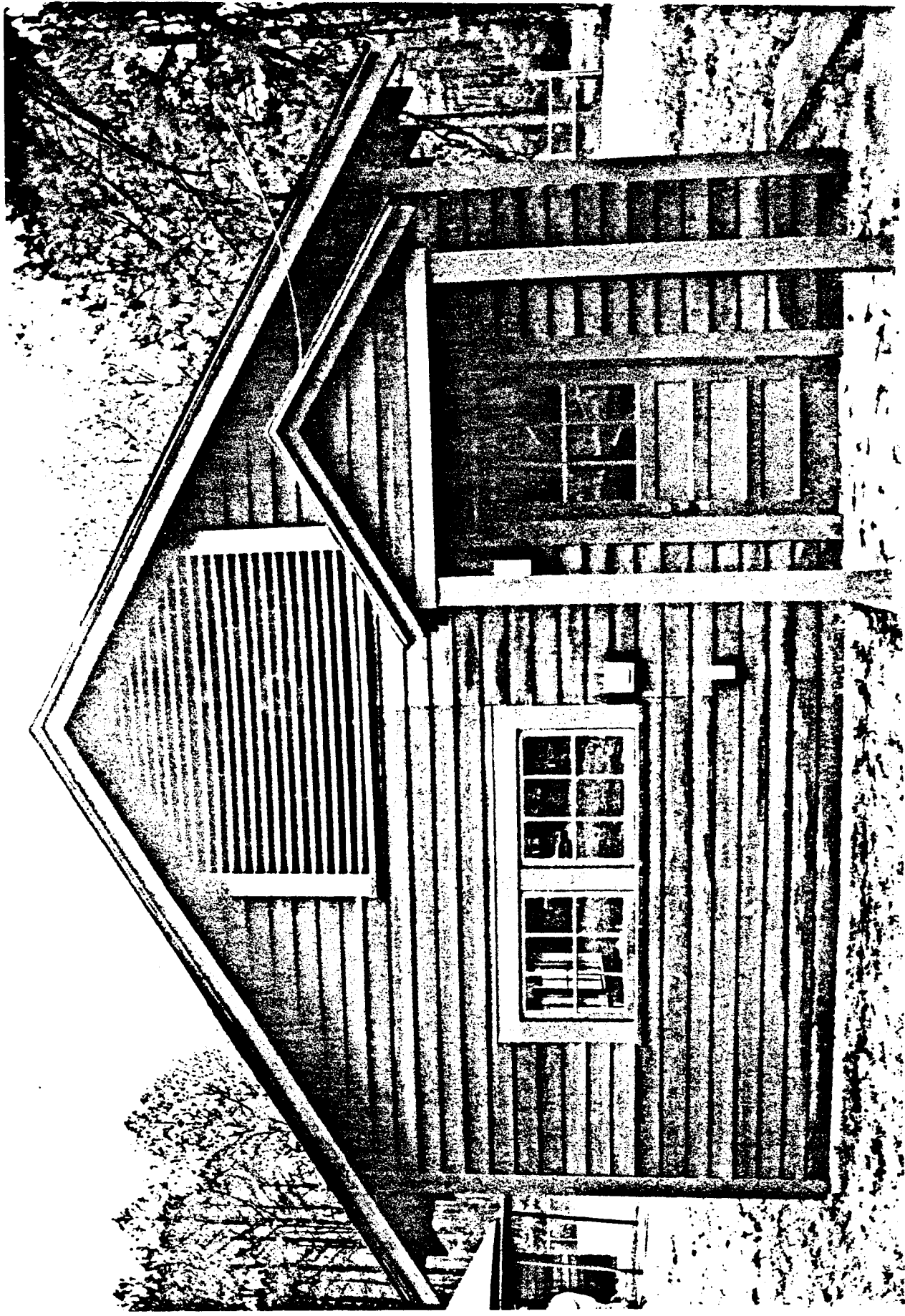

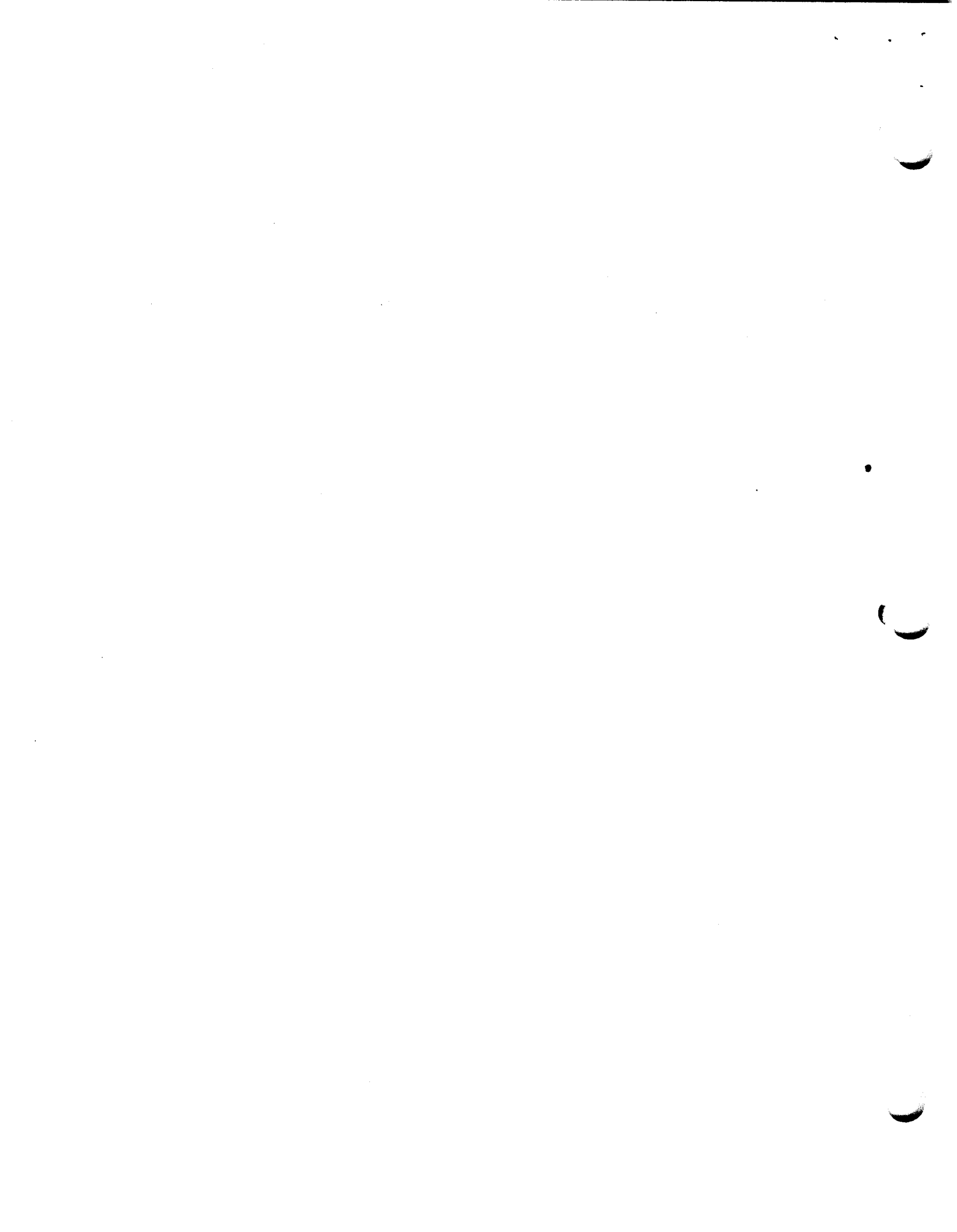
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The Crossett Experimental Forest Building #6 was constructed circa 1940 by members of the 768th Company of the Arkansas CCC District stationed at the Oden Camp that was located at Oden, in northwestern Montgomery County, though it was later moved further northwest to Buck Knob. It was constructed as part of the administrative headquarters for the Southern Experimental Forest of the Ouachita National Forest (ONF). This building was one of the office buildings for the Experimental Forest, and it continues to serve that purpose today. As such, the Crossett Experimental Forest Building #6 remains significant through its associations with the significant contributions to American social history made by the Civilian Conservation Corps and for its associations with the conservation movement that President Roosevelt intended this organization to serve, particularly within such protected federal lands as the national forests.
